Greensboro Beautiful Receives \$10,000 Grant from The UPS Foundation

Greensboro – Greensboro Beautiful, Inc., a non-profit, volunteer organization, recently received a \$10,000 grant from The UPS Foundation, the charitable arm of UPS. The grant will be used to fund this year’s NeighborWoods Community Tree Planting program.

The purpose of the program is to educate the community on the importance of trees and the role they play in improving air and water quality; reducing energy costs; increasing real estate values; providing wildlife habitat; and creating opportunities for residents to relax and enjoy nature. “Our trees help to define Greensboro and improve the quality of life throughout our community. We are extremely excited about The UPS Foundation’s support of this important program,” says Mike Cusimano, Urban Forester for the City of Greensboro.

The City of Greensboro, in collaboration with Greensboro Beautiful, the NC Cooperative Extension Service in Guilford County and the Greater Kirkwood Neighborhood Association will conduct the 2011 NeighborWoods Tree Planting Program on Saturday, November 5th. More than 150 volunteers including Boy and Girl Scout troops, students, residents, and church groups will be present to plant trees throughout the Kirkwood neighborhood to help restore tree cover lost during storms and development.

Development and implementation of this year’s program includes the collaborative efforts of Greensboro Beautiful; the following City of Greensboro Departments: Planning, Parks & Recreation, Water Resources, and Field Operations; the Kirkwood Neighborhood Association; and the NC Cooperative Extension Service in Guilford County.
